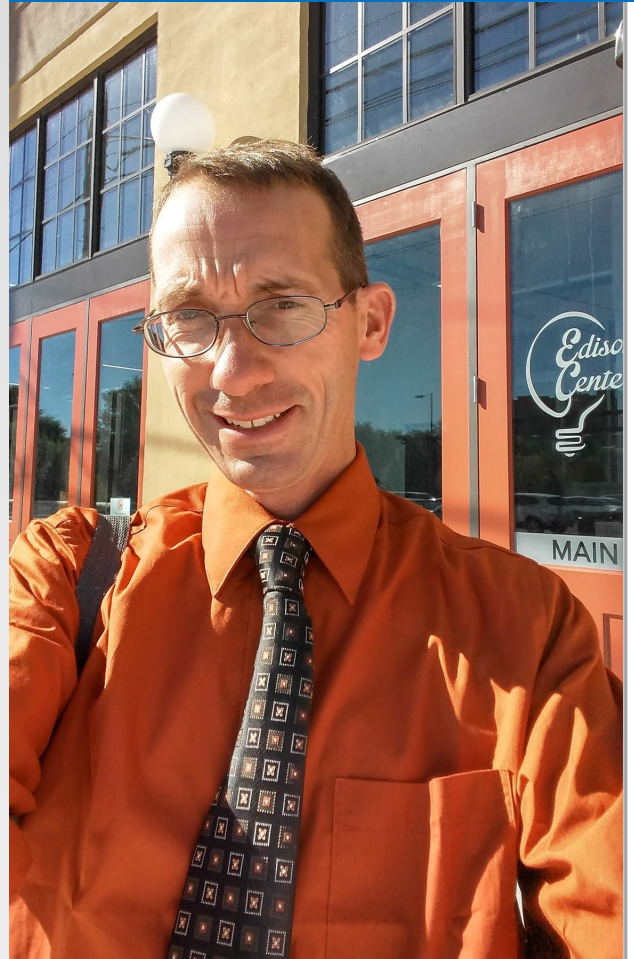
**Objectives:**

- \* To contribute to the self-reliance and empowerment of vulnerable and underprivileged children through education
- \* To provide justice and peace through organization of adult education, empowerment and relief provision programs to victims of social injustice, victims of trauma and violence and poor and widows
- \* To assist in the successful integration of migrant and refugee communities through organization of cultural activities, providing psychosocial support and job-oriented training programs
- \* To mobilize resources and extend emergency assistance during natural disasters and calamities
- \* To cherish the sacrifice and contributions made by the fighters of human rights and peace organizing literary, relief and cultural programs and to disseminate incidents of violation of human rights to the wider international community.

### Background

Devastating earthquakes hit Nepal on April 25 – 26, 2015 and then again on May 12, 2015, affecting 14 districts in the central development region. As per the Government of Nepal, the quakes and the aftershocks killed 8,800 injured more than 23,000 displaced 450,000 people, as well as destroyed more than 160,000 houses and 15,000 school buildings.

Also, around 2,000 children lost at least one of their parents during the earthquakes and most of these orphan children are from rural villages with no means of a support system left for them. Even in a normal situation, children living in rural Nepal face numerous difficulties having to help their guardians with household work, farming, cattle rearing, etc. Having to share these responsibilities, education becomes a lesser priority and school enrollment rates among poor rural children are lower when compared with rich urban areas; 59% against 94%. Furthermore, these same reasons lead to more high school dropouts among rural children in Nepal than in the urban areas. Children living in rural districts of Nepal are vulnerable and exposed to various forms of abuses. The effects of the devastating earthquakes along with their orphan status takes away their basic protection mechanisms exposing them to various forms of child exploitations and further abuses including child labor, trans-border child trafficking, etc.

After the massive earthquake, a large population in Nepal's rural area got under size. The earthquake had magnitude of 7.8 and its aftershocks destroyed scores of villages and left many children without parents and guardians. These orphan children were left with no one to take care of them resulting in their inability to go to school.

Punya Foundation took initiative to generate funds in supporting the educational need of selected children, despite the compelling need to extend help to children of similar fate. Donations of fund were mobilized through 2015 and 2016 to help children who lost one or both parents. A selective criterion was set in coordination with the village development committees and the School Management Committee Federation of Nepal.



The implementing partner of foundation, the SMC federation did all field visits and consulted the local leaders to direct the fund to the most vulnerable children in the villages of Dhading, Sindhupalchok, and Kavrepalanchok. They identified 50 students as most vulnerable who lost one or both of their parents.

Schools are being reconstructed mostly in the villages connected with the fair weather roads or those that are in suburban region. However, school conditions have not improved in the villages of these children as they live in remote hinterlands.

**Aim of the Program:** To empower the children living in the earthquake hit districts in Nepal through provision of scholarships for their education and to help them become independent.

### Program and Objectives

- ◆ To provide scholarships to the orphan children living in the earthquake hit districts in Nepal till they complete year 10 of education
- ◆ To enable children to go to school by providing basic necessities like stationery and uniforms
- ◆ To provide psychological counselling to orphan children, if needed, to cope with the experienced trauma and to facilitate continuing with their schooling
- ◆ To prevent orphan children from getting exploited from physical labor, from becoming domestic workers, maidservants and from trafficking for sex trade

### Essential Criteria

- Identified a person affected by the earthquakes by the Government of Nepal
- Have loss at least one of the guardians (Proof to be submitted–death certificate of the guardian to the local authority)
- School going or getting admitted to schools

### Secondary criteria

- Recommendation letter from the concerned schools
- Economically and socially excluded

### Scholarship Fund

Punya Foundation initiated a donation drive through online requests, skype conferences and personal conversation throughout 2015 as to create a Scholarship Fund sufficient to fulfil the basic minimum requirement of the children. The aim was to fund their education until the 10<sup>th</sup> grade.

A total amount of 9,610 AUD was sent to Nepal in 2016 routed through MoneyGram. It amounted to 796000 NRs. MoneyGram has been identified as best option to wiring money to Nepal as other methods are not cost effective. This amount is determined based on current school fees and material cost in Nepal. In post-earthquake market situations, the cost of the materials has increased significantly owing largely to destruction of rural roads. The additional funding available in 2016 enabled us to increase the number of scholarship to 83 as compared to 50 in 2015.

## Fund Disbursement

The scholarship amount was received by Mohan Niroula of SMC Federation Nepal. He/They travelled to those villages and handed over the fund to local guardians of the students, paid school fees and purchased school supplies-bags, uniforms, shoes, stationeries. The Scholarship Implementation Committee formed on behalf of Foundation acted as the vehicle to materialize this arduous task. They had to walk four to five hours from the nearest road to reach the students and visit their school.

### Challenges faced

- \* **Lack of baseline data:** The devastating earthquakes collapsed the government systems - infrastructure, service delivery and planning. Therefore, collection of authentic data took a long time, delaying the implementation of the scholarship program.
- \* **Geographical access:** Children on a scholarship program live scattered in far-flung rural areas with harsh topographical access. These areas are not accessible by public transport requiring on foot journey up to 3 days to visit children.
- \* **Financial constraints:** The scholarship program allocated very basic support for children. In addition, alongside the allocated overhead costs, delivering stationaries, school uniform, and other supplies required commitment of volunteers. This is a threat for the long-term project implementation and program sustainability.
- \* **Scholarship package:** The current scholarship package involves basic minimum support. With the inflation and post-earthquakes price hike, there is a valid need to increase the scholarship amount. The Foundation is under pressure to meet this challenge.

## Evaluation and Monitoring

The scholarship implementation committee (SIC) monitored the progress of fund use and school attendance of all recipients; evaluated the social and economic status of parents or guardians with whom the children live. The scholarship coordinators of SMC Federation contacted school head teachers to assess the progress of students and get feedbacks.

In first week of May 2016, Mr. Hari Pokhrel, an Australian based board member of the Foundation visited Jalbirey village of Sindhupalchok district to monitor the situation and take firsthand information of the scholarship students.

Though his private visit to Nepal, the Foundation requested Pokhrel to visit the schools and monitor the project. In coordination of the SMC Federation, Hari Pokhrel attended the scholarship distribution program in Sindhupalchok where he interacted with teachers, students and their guardians during a sponsored lunch, he overpowered it by his emotional outburst.

Mr. Pokhrel briefed the board meeting in Adelaide describing the situation in Nepal. The Foundation is assured of the donation reaching to target beneficiaries and that volunteers in the field are working honestly to support the vulnerable students.

## Changed Scenario

A few of the scholarship recipients have migrated out from their original home district. Four students of two families migrated out from Kavre to Chitwan. SMC federation does not see the need to support these students and it is extremely difficult to track progress of student and assess the family situation. In all the villages where scholarship recipients live, there is no progress in construction of schools. Classrooms continue to run still in makeshift shelters.

## Impact

The obvious impact of the scholarship is seen on the students themselves. They are happy to have chance to continue school who otherwise would turn into child laborers. The parents got relieved of their economic burden of sending their children to school. The community of rural poor who know about the scholarship hopes on continuation of such programs to support them. Expectations are high from other poor families to receive the scholarship funds for their children too.

Punya Foundation believes supporting the children's education to 10<sup>th</sup> grade will obviously improve their chance to seek higher secondary education.

In the case of children who lost both parents, and now taken over by immediate relatives, there appears to be a psychological stress thrown upon them by the guardians. Some sort of bias exists on the part of these guardians, since their own children are not the recipients of PF scholarship.

## Background

Ethiopia is located in the North-East part of Africa. Oromia Region is Ethiopia's largest national regional state. West Shewa zone is one of the 18 zones of Oromia Regional state. Gindabarat district is one of the 18 districts of West Shewa zone. Mukadima is one of the 33 villages in Gindabarat district from where four vulnerable students are selected for scholarship.

Punya Foundation identified Moti Muleta, the Zonal Health officer of West Shewa zone owing to personal connection with Dr. Lakshmi Prashad Dhakal of the Foundation while in the Netherlands. Thus, this is a remote district of Gindabarat of Ethiopia.

## Problem statement

About 85 % of the population in Gindabarat district lives in rural areas and economically dependent on subsistence farming. Many families can't afford to send their children to schools and school dropout rate is high, mostly among the poorer families. As a pilot project, the Punya Foundation in collaboration with the School Management Board of Mukadima decided to support the education of four vulnerable children. This is an attempt to empower children through education and to provide relief to their parents.

Mukadima village is in a remote and geographically inaccessible area known as the Gindabarat district with majority of people living under poverty line. In the village, there is no institutional support for education of poor and vulnerable children. In addition, local schools showed willingness to implement and monitor the scholarship program.

## Reaching out to Mukadima

Giving continuity to its scholarship program for poor and vulnerable students in Africa, the Foundation established a partnership with the School Management Board of Mukadima in 2015. Following a few rounds of telephone conference calls, Mr. Moti Muleta, (Zonal Health Officer) of the Zonal Health Department, Foundation decided to provide scholarships to four vulnerable students from a remote village of Mukadima. During the meetings, the Foundation agreed with the School Management Board of Mukadima on the following as selection criteria:

- ⇒ Primary school students or student attending primary school in the village of Mukadima.
- ⇒ Students identified as both poor and vulnerable by the school management committee and by the Women and Children Affairs Member.

For the management and disbursement of scholarship fund, a Scholarship selection and Implementation Committee (SSIC) was formed and consisted of the following 5 members:

1. Moti Muleta from Zonal Health Department, Chairperson
2. Abdisa Kebede Mukadima, School Director, Secretary
3. Beza Werk Giorgis, Women and Children Affairs, Member
4. Chaluma Walteji, School Management Board, Member
5. Girma Dinka, Elder from the community

## Scholarship Fund

A total amount of 660 Australian dollars was wired to Ethiopia through MoneyGram, received by Mr. Moti Muleta.

It amounted to 10,519.95 Birr (Ethiopian currency), calculated to be just enough for purchasing school materials, uniforms and other basic needs for the four children identified as vulnerable.

The fund is managed by the five member committee listed above with Mr. Moti Muleta as the chief contact point for the Punya Foundation. He has the sole with responsibility of managing and monitoring the scholarship fund.

## Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation

The Scholarship Selection and Implementation Committee (SSIC) is responsible for the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the scholarship program. The SSIC has in collaboration with the head teachers distributed school uniforms, stationeries, and basic school materials to the students.

For effective implementation geared towards fulfilling objectives, the SSIC shall:

- ◆ Seek school attendance and performance of the students on a quarterly basis.
- ◆ Review the project inputs, activities, and outputs two times per year.
- ◆ Seek feedback from students and from their guardians.
- ◆ Review the program's costs.
- ◆ Grade report document analysis and in case of need home visit for further exploration of home situation.

This committee worked hard to reach out to the school as well as the students and parents for providing the needed help for making all four recipients to go back to school.

### Challenges:

- Limited availability of the funds.
- Challenges to select few vulnerable children from large pool of poor people.
- Geographic inaccessibility owing to lack of public transport and difficult terrain.

### Opportunities:

- The local community is very supportive and committed to provide needed help to make the scholarship program successful.
- The school head teachers are willing to work on a voluntary basis for effective implement the project.

# WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

## Coffee and Tea program:

Punya Foundation supported a women empowerment program in Ethiopia that helped participating women to generate income. The program operates with low cost and a budget of six thousand Ethiopian currencies with only 2000 birr as initial investment cost.

In town of Ambo, underprivileged women were targeted to operate tea and coffee making business. A fifty year old woman named Abebech Eio Marga was the recipient of the fund in its first phase.

The annual return of income by selling coffee and tea was estimated at 5200 Birr.

## Poultry Farming program:

Rearing poultry is common way of getting family income in rural West Shewa zone of Oromia region state in Ethiopia. In response to the proposal received from Zonal health officer, Punya Foundation decided to support underprivileged women for income generation activity of poultry farming.

The program is implemented in two locations of the Ginderberat district- Ambo and Kachisi town. It is a low cost program, easy to manage and has sustainable income generating activity for poor women. The total investment is just 6000 Birr.

### Factors considered in choosing poultry farming:

- ◆ Chicken houses and hatchery can be constructed at low cost.
- ◆ Chicken rearing is a traditional farming practice in Ethiopia, so need less skill for taking care.
- ◆ Chicken grow faster (in 75 days chicken become ready to go to market), so income is faster
- ◆ Favorable climate.
- ◆ Easy access to market.

In 2016, three vulnerable women were chosen to participate in income generating through poultry farming:

1. Alami Waggi Safara, 40, is a single woman with five children.
2. Shitaye Kineni Daba, 30, is unmarried woman
3. Sidisu Tulu Nemayo, 30, is unmarried, with no parents

### Impact

In general terms, both women empowerment programs in Ethiopia have generated zeal of interest in other similar income groups for those programs served model of socio-economic improvement.

The programs are designed to be sustainable and the income generated by women has helped to invest more in the program.

*Last year, the Punya Foundation gave us an opportunity to perform a spiritual performance during its fundraising program - Puran. Though Divya and myself have performed dances in numerous occasions, we were hesitant to perform a spiritual dance. We had never done that before and there was virtually lack of guidance. But, no surprise, our parents are there. They convinced us that we need to take the challenge and we will make it good.*

*We selected a bhajan, which is a song sung for glory of god during religious program. We prepared and practiced watching on the YouTube. At the beginning, it was difficult for us to catch the rhythm of the music, adapt bodily movement in spiritual context and demonstrate facial expressions to match with the bhajan. As we practiced, we got tuned and found it easier and enjoyed the bhajan for dance. After a week, we were ready to perform. At the start of the performance we were a bit nervous because most of the audience were elderly people and we didn't know whether our performance would be entertaining. After the performance, elderly relatives and family members gave us encouraging feedbacks that gave us more courage and confidence for our future performances.*

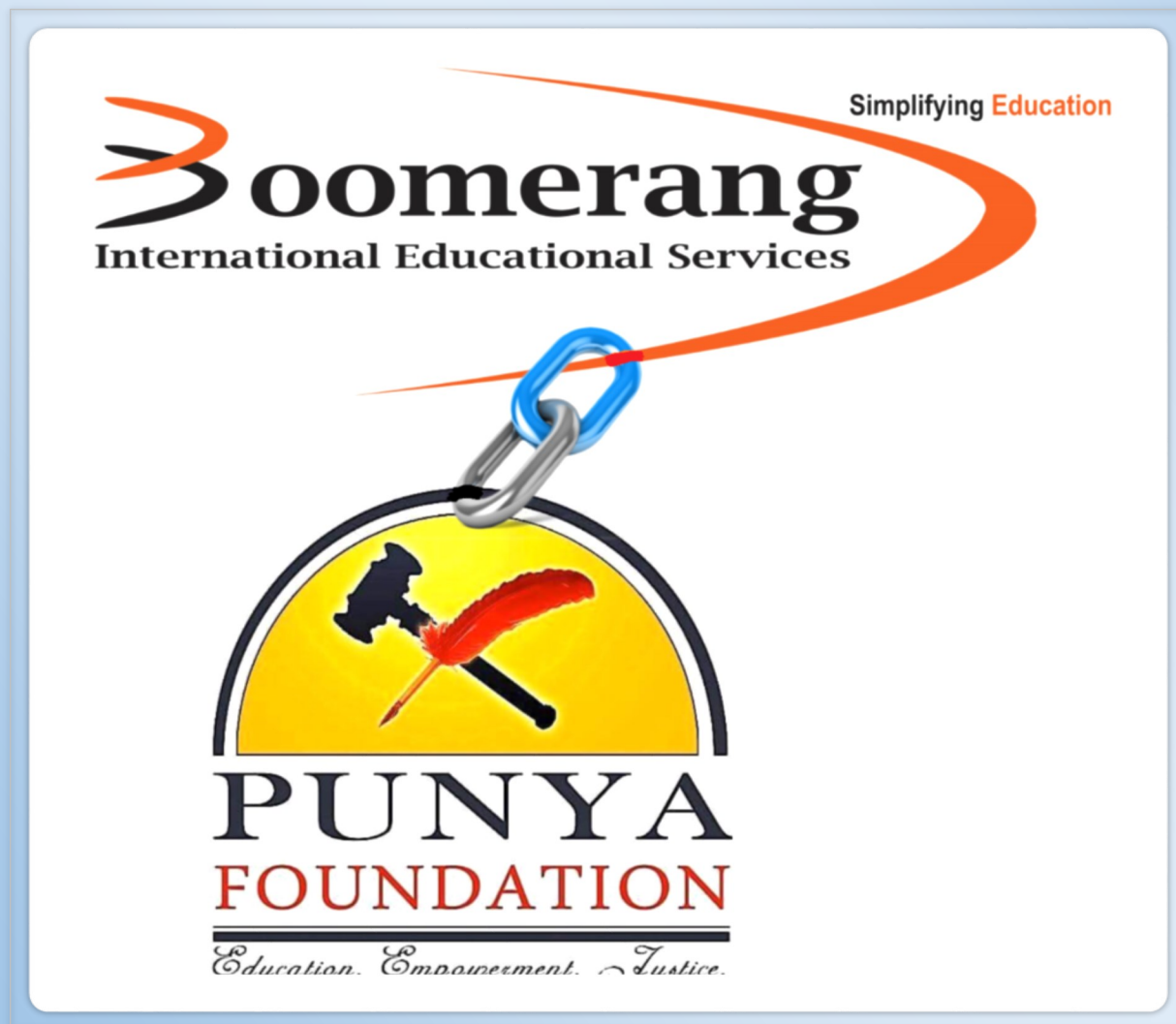
### **ABA Youths raise fund for Education in Nepal**

Anita, 13 years, is from Kiul VDC, Ward No. 4, Sindhupalchwok in Mid Development Region in Nepal. She is a student of Shree Bhumeshwori Higher Secondary School, Kiul. She is the youngest in her family and her siblings are separated from her family. Her father is almost 80 years old. Her mother became mentally disturbed after the devastating earthquake of 25th April 2015. Her father is facing hardships to run his family and not managing to support Anita's education needs. Jharana, 16, is aiming to be a nurse. She is from Kiul VDC, ward No. 4, Sindhupalchwok in Mid Development region in Nepal. She studies at Terse Higher Secondary School, Talarang. Up to class eight she studied in various schools in Kathmandu with the help of various organizations. When the help stopped, she returned to her maternal uncles home and joined school hopping to get help to continue her education.

During the earthquake of 25th April 2015, they lost their shelter and Nima's father became disabled who was the key person to earn living in their family. Now they are living under plastic shelter. Due to the earthquake their land became uncultivable. So the entire family had to be resettled. Because of the poverty of his family his mother is not in a condition to fulfill his dream to become a driver in future.



Puspa, 11 years, lives with her mother in Gumdi VDC Ward No. 8, Dhading district in Mid Development Region of Nepal. She is a student of Class 5 at Tamang Kharka Higher Secondary School, Gumdi. She is born out of marriage so nobody knows who is her father. When she was 4 years old, her mother left her marrying another man. Her aunt is giving her a shelter. Puspa wants to become a staff nurse.





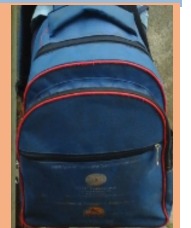
**Sujan**, 14 years, lives with his maternal uncle in Gumdi VDC, Ward No.2, Dhading district in Mid Development Region of Nepal. He is a student of class 8 studying at Tamang Kharka Higher Secondary School, Gumdi. His father left home marrying another woman when he was eight and her mother eloped to another man when he was 10. Since then he is staying in his maternal uncle's house. His uncle is having difficulty to support his education and Sujan is venerable to drop his school. He wants to be a schoolteacher after completing his study. He is in need of support.

**Bishnu**, 16, lives with his grandmother in Gumdi VDC ward No 7 Dhading District in Mid Development region of Nepal. He is studying in grade 8 in Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School Gumdi. When the family was fighting with the extreme poverty, Bishnu lost his father during the earthquake of 25th April 2015. After six months, his mother left him marrying another man. Now, he is living with his grandmother who is very old to take care of him. To complete his study, Bishnu needs support. He wants to become an army.



**Amrita**, 16 years, is the first daughter of Kaji Man Gurung and Dhanshri Gurung. She is from Gumdi VDC Ward no 9, Dhading. She is a student of grade 8 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary, Gumdi. Amrita wants to be a social worker. When she was 8 years, her mother lost her eyesight and father became disabled. Being their eldest child in the family, she bears a lot of responsibilities in her family. Amrita is determined to continue with her education and appeals for support. She wants to become an accountant.

**Rajesh**, 15 years, is from Gumdi VDC ward No 6 Dhading in Mid Development Region. He is a student of class 9 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School, Dhading. During devastating earthquake of 25th April 2015, their house collapsed and parents got buried under the rubbles. Fortunately, they were able to survive but became disabled and mother needed to be hospitalized for 7 months. He wants to become a policeman and his family is looking for support for his education.



**Smriti**, 14 years, is from Gumdi VDC ward No 3 Dhading in Mid Development region, Nepal. She is studying in class 9 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School, Dhading. During the earthquake of 2015, her house got destroyed; her father got trapped in it and lost his life. Her father was the only responsible person for making their life possible. She wants to become a nurse and is desperately looking for support to make her education a success.

**Nir Maya**, 22 years, is from Gumdi VDC ward No 4 Dhading in Mid Development region, Nepal. She studies in class 9 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School, Dhading. She is the eldest daughter among six siblings so she did not get chance to go to school earlier. She joined school with her youngest sister at the age of 10. During the earthquake of 2015, she not only lost her house but also her father. She wants to be a social worker to stop child marriage.



**Rajina**, 10 years, is from Gumdi VDC, ward No 6, Dhading in Mid Development region, Nepal. She is studying in class 6 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School in Dhading. She is from an underprivileged ethnic group. Her parents are from Terai, who came to Dhading in search of job. They have neither a house nor any property. Her parents are daily wage earner. Rejina wants to develop her future carrier as a schoolteacher.

Ram Bahadur, 18 years, is from Gumdi VDC ward No 5 Dhading in Mid Development region, Nepal. He is a student of class 9 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School, Dhading. His father became physically disabled during the earthquake of 2015, who was responsible for supporting the family. After the earthquake the Gurung family was compelled to shift into a temporary shelter. He wants to join British Army after completing his class XII education.



Rabina, 14 years, is from Gumdi VDC ward No 5 Dhading in Mid Development region, Nepal. She is studying in class 9 at Tamang Kharkha Higher Secondary School, Dhading. During the earthquake of 2015, she lost her father and her house collapsed. Now they are living in a temporary shelter. She wants to develop her future career as a staff-nurse after completing her education. To make this possible, Rabina is in need of help to support her educational expenses.

Roj Kumari, 15 years, is a student of class 8 in Bal Secondary School, Bitijor, Sindhuli in Mid Development Region. She has lost both of her parents. Now she lives with her brothers who are visually impaired. Roj Kumari is facing hardship to make her education possible. After her School Leaving Certificate, she wants to join technical course to earn her own living.



Goma, 6 years, is a daughter of Chiranjibi and Debaki Regmi. She is a student of Bal Secondary School, Bitijor, Sindhuli in Mid Development Region. Living in far-flung hilly area, Goma walks approximately 8 km a day to attend her school. Her parents, who live on subsistence farming, have a poor financial situation. Goma deserves support to make her schooling possible and to change her future.



Sajana, 14 years, is a daughter of Kul Bahadur Thapa and Laxmi Thapa. She lives in Bhubaneshoree 3, Gwaltar, Sindhuli in Mid Development Region. Now she is a student of class 8 in Kausika Secondary School. Her parents work in farm and hardly meet their daily needs. Without support from others, Sajana is unlikely to continue her education. In the future she wants to be a lawyer.

Umesh, 14 years, a permanent resident of Jhule-6 Dolakha in Mid Development Region, now lives in Kathmandu. He is a Student of class 8 in Mangala Devi Secondary School, Gausala, Kathmandu. His Father lives separately with his stepmother. His mother committed suicide last year. Therefore, he lives with his two brothers and a physically disable sister in a rented house in Kathmandu. Umesh wants to continue his education and become a computer engineer in future.

Rupesh, 12 years, a permanent resident of Jhule-6 Dolakha in Mid Development Region, lives in Kathmandu (His brother Umesh is also supported by the Foundation). He is studying in class 8 in Mangala Devi Secondary School, Gausala, Kathmandu. His father lives separately with his stepmother. His mother committed suicide last year. Therefore, he lives with two brother and a physically handicap sister in rented house in Kathmandu. Like his elder brother, Rupesh wants to continue his education and become a computer engineer in future.



Deepa BK, 14 years, is a daughter of Padam Bahadur BK and Pabitra BK from Deupur VDC Ward no 3. She is a student of grade 7 studying at Uma Bidhya Mandir Lower Secondary School. The devastating earthquake of 2015 killed her father and destroyed her home completely. Given vulnerable background of BK family, these children are likely to turn to child labor. Deepa wants to study, be independent and dreams to become a health worker.



Bikash Tamang is a son of Sujan Lama and Aaite Maya Lama. He is 10 years old studying in grade 3 in Uma Bidhya Mandir, Mahadevsthan, Kavre. He is 2nd child out of 4 children. He aims to be a football player in his future.

His entire family depends on daily wage working at a brick factory. With out external support, Bikash is likely to drop out from school.



Subin Shrestha is 13 years old studying in grade 5 in Uma Bidhya Mandir, Mahadevsthan, Kavre. He has 6 members in his family living in extreme poverty. Subin is good in his studies. He wants to be a science teacher in future. The earthquake of 2015 destroyed their small hut. The family has not managed to build up a house. Subin needs support to meet his school cost and needs for help.



Sabita BK is the eldest daughter of Manohari and Manamaya BK. She is a 14 years old studying in grade 6 at Uma Bidhya Mandir, Mahadevsthan, Kavre. She wants to be a social worker in future and work to eliminate caste based discrimination from her community. She wants to help poor people to overcome their poverty. She is a vulnerable child due to her ethnic background. Unless some support is provided to her, she will drop out from school.

Mohima Sapkota is the eldest daughter of Mahesh Sapkota and Rita Sapkota out of 3 children. She is 13 years and studies in grade 6. She is brilliant among students of her class. She wants to become a nurse in future. But, her financial situation cannot support her to continue her studies. Temporarily, some of her teachers in her schools are supporting Mohima for stationery and school fees. She needs support to keep going with her education.



Kopila Tiwari is the daughter of Mr. Ramchandra Tiwari and Sarita Tiwari. She is 14 years old and studying at grade 8 in Uma Bidhyamandir at Mahadevsthan, Kavre. She is very intelligent girl among students of her class leading in all academic activities. She aims to become a nurse in future. However, the poverty in her family is posing a challenge to Kopila to maker her dream come true. She looks forward to a long-term support to help her achieve goal.

Bikram BK, 10 years boy, is the second son of Sita Ram BK and Sita BK. He is from Deupur VDC Ward No. 9. He is a student of grade 3 at Uma Bidhya Mandir. The devastating earthquake of April 2015 caused a great catastrophe to his life. Their house got completely destroyed and killed both of his parents. The family is struggling for day-to-day basic needs. Now they live with their grandfather, who is very old and unable to work and Bikram. Education is impossible without external support. He wishes to become an artist.



Sarita Tamang is 12 years is a daughter of Ram Bdr Tamang and Kamali Tamang. Her parents are disabled. She is from Devitaar VDC-7, Kavre. She studies in grade 4. Sarita wants to school, she is a good dancer and wants to become a dance teacher in future. Sartia and her parents are looking for a help to assist her realize her dream.



Ranjita Mizar is 8 years who does not have both of his parents. Father left when she was a child and mother passed away. Her grandmother, whose health condition is guarded, is taking care of her. She studies in grade 2 at Darimbot Primary School at Kavre-5. She is a child at risk owing to her ethnic background and requires support to make her education possible.



Aarati Sapkota is the second daughter out of 3 of Janga Bahadur and Parbati Sapkota. She is 14 years old and studies in grade 7 in Uma Bidhya Mandir, Mahadevsthan, Kavre. She is a very brilliant student in her class. She aims to become a schoolteacher in future. The financial situation of her family is very poor. Aarati requires support to meet her school expenses and requests for continued help.

Rabina Shrestha is a second daughter of Krishna Shrestha and Sanu Maya Shrestha. She is a 8th grader student in Uma Bidhya Mandir at Mahadevstha VDC, Kavre. Shrestha family lost their house during the earthquake of 2015. Rabina is one of the brilliant students of the school. She aims to become a medical doctor in future. However, her parents who work on daily wage and struggling to meet basic needs of their family are not in a position to materialize Rabina's dream. Her parents and Rabina are desperately looking for support.



Amrit BK, 13 years boy, is the first son of Sita Ram BK and Sita BK. He is from Deupur VDC Ward no 9. He is a student of grade 6 at Uma Bidhya Mandir. The devastating earthquake of 25 April 2015 brought a great catastrophe to his life. Their house got completely destroyed taking lives of both of his parents. He has a younger brother, Bikram BK of 9 years. Now these boys live with their grandfather who is very old and unable to work. Going to school is impossible with out external support. He wishes to be a football player in future.

Abinash Tamang is a second son of disabled father Rana Bdr Tamang and Saile Tamang. 12 year old, Abinash is from Devitar VDC-7 and studies at Devisthan Ma Vi in class 4. He is very hardworking and good in his studies. Abinash needs support to keep going to school and there is no one to support him for this. He is at high risk of leaving school and becoming a domestic child labor. Abinash wants to become a music teacher and is looking for a help to make his education possible.



Binisha Gautam is the daughter of Yana Maya Gautam. Binisha's father died when she was 3 years old. She is 8 years studying in grade 2 in Danphe Primary Schools in Pathlekhet, Kavre. She is very active girl. Her mother works on daily wages. Living a very poor life as a single parent, Yana Maya is struggling to send her 2 children to school and looking for help to assist her to educate her children.

Bhim Bdr Blon is the eldest son of Fulimaya Blon. He is from Dhungkharka-8, Kavre and studies in Bethanchok Narayan School in grade 8. He is good in his studies. Being a son of a poor and single woman, he struggles to attend his classes. His mother works on wages. The community people and schoolteachers are providing some support to Blon children after their father expired. He wants to become a schoolteacher in future. He is also a child at high risk of getting pushed to domestic work.



Yubaraj Waiba is second child in his family and is 11 years old. He is from a very poor family and lives in Chysingkharka VDC ward no 3. His father is paralysed. Yubaraj studies in grade two in Aatma Bikash Higher Secondary School at Chysingkharka. Given fragile family background and poor financial situation, Yubaraj needs support to keep going to school.



Shanju Tamang is a student of Kepper Lower Secondary School studying in grade 5. She is the eldest daughter of Lt Antare Tamanag. She is 13 years old. Both of her parents expired. She has a younger sister and both of them are living with aged grandmother at Chyasingkharka VDC, Kavre. She is at high risk to drop out from school. She is also at high risk to be a domestic child labor. Shanju needs support to get education and keep her out of abuse.



Radhika Sigdel is a daughter of Bhimsen Sigdel. She is 11 years old. She studies in grade 2 at Chandeshwori Sec. School, Tuchucha 2, Kavre. She lives under extreme poverty. She is very sharp girl and aims to become a singer in future. She requests for a long-term support to study and help her to become a singer.

**Abisha Thapa** is 7 years, daughter of Surendra Thapa from Tukucha Nala, Kavre. She studies in grade 2 at Indrashova Lower Secondary School. She is a very brilliant girl but the extreme poverty of her family is leading to give less priority sending her to school.

Aananda Darlami is a son of Mr. Krishna Darlami. He is 7 years old and a second child in his family. He has just started school and studies at grade 1 at Chandeshwori Secondary School in Ugrachandi Nala 5. His mother is suffering from severe mental disorder and father struggling to find a balance in the family. Aananda needs help to go to school.



**Sarin Bajgain** is a second daughter of physically disabled parents. She is 3 years and her parents are mentally retarded. Her parents cannot support her studies. Sarin has just been enrolled in ECD class and is supported temporarily by her neighbors. The community and schoolteachers recommended her for the Punya Foundation scholarship.
