## Punya Foundation

The Punya Foundation is a non-profit charity forum established with a mission of justice through education and empowerment. The target groups of the foundation are those people who need support to live a dignified life.

The foundation assists underprivileged and rendered vulnerable children with their education. It focuses on welfare of women in fronts of social issues like mediation programs and empowerment via adult education. Operating on the principles of fundamental human rights, the foundation raises voice against violation of human rights bringing social injustice to international forums.

### NEPAL SCHOLARSHIP

To empower children living in the earthquake hit districts in Nepal, the Punya Foundation has been providing scholarships for education of children who lost at least one of their parents during earthquakes of 2015.

#### Program Objectives

- To provide scholarships to the orphan children living in the earthquake hit districts in Nepal till they complete year 10 education
- To enable children to go to schools by providing basic necessities like stationery and school uniforms
- To prevent orphan children from getting exploited from physical labour, from becoming domestic workers, maidservants and from trafficking for sex trade

#### Facts and figures

- 74 children are receiving scholarships under the initiative orphan education
- 17 students from Kavre District, 21 from Sindhupalchok and 36 from Dhading
- 57 of these children are sponsored by the Punya Foundation
- Punya Foundation Nepal supports 17 students from locally generated resources.

Punya Foundation Nepal is established in 2017 with wider goals to support Nepal at the fronts of education, social justice and empowerment. It is registered as a charity company, not distributing profit, under section 5, sub-section 1, Company act 2006.



## Nepal team gains local support

The Nepal team is very active and has secured financial support to sponsor education of 17 vulnerable students.

### Library Support

The Punya Foundation team Nepal donated books to Shree Tamang Kharka HS School, Tamangkharka, Dhading and Shree Kalika HS School, Phulpingkot, Sindhupalchok. This project is materialised through donation received from well wishers and with their own contribution – both cash, and in kind as books. The team generated an amount worth four hundred thousand NRS.

### Tracksuit program

From 2017, the Punya Foundation provides a pair of tracksuit to students under the scholarship program. This program is initiated coinciding with schools' requirement and also considering extremes of weather condition. Children have expressed gratefulness for making their wishes come true.

Since last 3 years, the Foundation has been working in a partnership with the School Management Board of Mukadima to provide education support. Mr. Moti Muleta, Zonal Health Officer, of the Zonal Health Department has been the principal contact person. 4 students were receiving scholarships from the Foundation. In 2017, the number of scholarship recipients has increased to 5. Target groups are primary school students from the village of Mukadima in Ethiopia.

For the management and disbursement of scholarship fund, a Scholarship selection and Implementation Committee (SSIC) was formed consisting of 5 members.

## Scholarship fund

A total amount of 650 Australian dollars was wired to Ethiopia through MoneyGram, received by Mr. Moti Muleta; the amount for scholarships and for women empowerment program.

Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation: The SSIC is responsible for the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the scholarship program. The SSIC distributed school uniforms, stationeries, and basic school materials to the students in collaboration with the local stakeholders.

This committee reached out to school in rural area and as well as the students and their parents. Local people, school authority and parents have expressed thanks for helping them educate vulnerable children.

## Sustainable empowerment

Not possessing a sheep is a symbol of poverty in Oromia. In 2017, the scholarship implementing team in Ethiopia wanted to buy a lamb for each child who is under the scholarship program. This is to empower children and to give them moral boost, that they are no more poor.

Sustainable indeed – already each child has 2 sheep. Happy parents and happy children!

## Spiritual Program for education of vulnerable children

The Foundation organized a three-day Shreemad Bhagawat Puran in November 2017 with an objective to generate fund for education of orphan children in Nepal. This program organized in Adelaide is 3rd in succession.

### Methodology

- The Foundation executive team in Australia, through a succession of meetings, detailed a program outline and assigned major responsibilities
- Venue and modalities finalized as per feasibility and convenience
- Invitation, awareness and PR done to materialize program objective

### Major responsibilities

Mr Hari Pokhrel was assigned with overall coordination responsibility. However, Mr Mohan Bhattarai took it over due to Mr Pokhrel's family engagements. Pundit Santi Ram Upadhaya Dhakal was responsible for spiritual aspects and Mr JN Bhandari for purchasing groceries and amenities essential for the program.

### Activities

- Program was inaugurated by Minister Zoe Bettison
- Spiritual sermons were provided by Pundit Dinesh Adhikari, Swami Khagendra Neopane, Pundit Santi Ram Upadhaya Dhakal and Pundit Raj Panday, a representative of Biswa Hindu Parishad
- Kirtan by various teams and spiritual dances by difference groups of community members
- Ethnic school children performed a dance
- Acknowledgment and distribution of certificates

### Outcome

- The program, like in the past years, ended with huge applause. This year's spiritual program is considered more inclusive.
- The program managed to collect around 8,000 AUD. After expenditure saved amount equivalent to educate 26 students in Nepal for one year.

### Lessons and reflections

- Too intense and volunteers energy consuming. Probably, the future needs to look for alternative options
- Community appreciation of program and recommendation for similar nature of activities for engagement of elderlies

## Coffee and Tea program

The Punya Foundation runs a women empowerment program in Ethiopia. The program is geared at helping vulnerable women generate income. The program operates with a minimal cost. A n initial budget of about 2000 birr (Ethiopian currency) investment is helping 3 women run income generating activities.

In town of Ambo, underprivileged women were targeted to operate tea and coffee making business. A fifty-year-old woman named Abebech Eio Marga was the recipient of the fund in its first phase. Implementing partner mention the annual return by selling coffee and tea was approximately 5200 Birr.

The other program the Foundation run in Ethiopia is poultry farming. The Punya Foundation collaborated with Zonal Health Office to implement this program.



In 2016 the Foundation officially started to express condolences to family members who lost their loved ones. The Foundation executive team decided to express its moral support donating a small amount.

Mr JN Bhandari initiates an art empowerment project in Salisbury North for children born to refugee parents. The program is with an assertion that arts enhances intrinsic motivation, assists in career progression and expression in thematic perspectives.

## FUND GENERATION

Sydney based ABA-Youths has been generating funds through entertaining dinner program since last 3 years. The ABA- Youths is a team of committed youths partnering the Foundation to support education of vulnerable children in Nepal.

The ABA-Youths sponsors 10 students under orphan education program.



Spiritual programs in Australia have been the major fundraising medium of the Foundation since last couple of years. Among others, Puran, Kirtan, recitation and Hom and Hawan are few to mention.



Since a couple of years, people around the globe have been donating to the Punya Foundation on name of deceased loved ones. Children of Late Hema Bhandari donated an amount equivalent to educate 2 children for one year.



In January 2017, on initiation of Foundation's well-wisher Mr Deepak Lama with close coordination of Mr Tilchand Sapkota, a fund raising dinner program was organised. Through the program, the Foundation managed to build awareness on its education program in Nepal with an intention to get their support.

In 2017 the Foundation continued to receive individual donations deposited on its bank account as well as online donation through the PayPal. Unlike past years, donation through online modality has dropped, likely because of inadequate follow up and coordination.
