# Mission, Vision, Values & Objectives

#### MISSION:

Punya Foundation was established as a charity with a mission of Justice through Education and Empowerment. It operates on the principle of social justice.

#### **VISION:**

The vision of Punya Foundation is to become an organization which works towards a fair and equitable society, empowering those communities subjected to calamities/disasters, violence and social exclusion.

#### VALUES:

- Punya Foundation believes that Fairness and Justice should prevail upon all sections of a population and that can be realized with creating access to opportunities by fair distribution of local, national and international resources.
- Punya Foundation affirmatively considers that educated and empowered community is only possible through fair and equitable distribution of physical and intellectual resources, along with equal access to the means for decent livelihoods.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- To contribute to the self-reliance and empowerment of vulnerable and underprivileged children through education.
- To institutionalise social justice and peace through organisation of adult education, empowerment and relief programs to victims of social injustice, destitute, victims of trauma and violence and poor and widows.
- To assist in the successful integration of refugees and migrant communities through organising cultural activities, providing psychosocial support, career counselling and job-oriented training programs.
- To promote healthy living through health advocacy and organising outreach clinics.

### PROJECTS BY GEOGRAPHICAL REGIONS

### Nepal

- Sindhupalchok district in Bagmati Province, some 60 km east of Kathmandu, the district largely populated by indigenous people of Nepal. People largely dependent on agriculture- subsistence farming and animal husbandry. The district was one hit by devastating 2015 Earthquakes- many children rendered orphan.
- Scholarship awarded to 25 children of poor and vulnerable families, families affected by earthquake, living in Balefi village municipality, and Chautara Sangachokgadi village municipality.
- The students attend public schools: Kalika Devi Secondary school, Shree Ananda Secondary school and Kup Kanya secondary school.
- Both these are remote villages, almost 10 km away from the road connecting to nearest town.
- On average, students walk almost 6 km to and from school daily.
- Dhading district in Bagmati Province District on southwest of Kathmandu valley with large agrarian population, people's source of income depends on crops, poultry and cattle farming. A hilly district adjacent to Kathmandu metropolis, yet remote in terms of educational and health facilities.
- 25 students awarded scholarship in Ganga Jamuna village municipality. It is almost 20 km away from nearest road head.
- Students attend 2 public schools- Tamang Kharka secondary school and Panchakanya primary school. Students walk to and from school on average 2hrs daily.
- 19 students of very poor families who are living in Kathmandu Valley are also awarded scholarships on the basis of their poverty- parents working as menial jobs like construction labourers, housemaids, and in brick factory. 19 students from various parts of Nepal, but residing within the valley are going to public schools.

## **Projects by Geographical Regions**

### Nepal

- Scholarship to five visually impaired female students: Students from different parts (provinces) of Nepal awarded scholarship. They attend colleges in various district for Bachelor's level course of Tribhuvan University.
  - Rupandehi (Lumbini province in Terai)
  - Sindhupalchok (Bagmati Province)
  - Kanchanpur (Sudur Paschim province in Far west)
  - Humla (Karnali province in Mountain)

### Ethiopia

• Total of 9 students awarded scholarship, five new in 2022. These children belong to poor families living in remote parts of Ambo town, whose source of income is subsistence farming and cattle rearing. Often these are large families who cannot afford to send children to school because of food and income poverty.

### Health and relief

- Nepal program— various locations in Terai.
- \* Health awareness among the legally blind and visually impaired females supported with menstrual health and food safety education in collaboration with BWAN. Participants were given packets of health kits/supplies.
- Blanket and coat/jacket distribution to the homeless people in Columbus, Ohio.
- Thanksgiving lunch served to homeless people in Fort Worth, Texas.

## **Projects by Geographical Regions**

### Nepal

### **Empowerment:**

Three levels of computer training offered to students in Beldangi camp. 120 Students from within the camp and surrounding village of Damak Municipality are taking the course. CTEVT recognized certificates will be awarded after completing six months course. They will be able to enter into job market that demands computer skills.

This training center was made possible by generous funding from a group of youths living in the US. The contribution from Lochan Khatiwada, Bhuwan Acharya, Chandra Upreti, Mon Poudel and Carrick Pharmacy helped in renovating an old classroom to turn it into a full scale computer training facility.

No empowerment program in Ethiopia for 2022 due to internal conflict. In past years micro-finance grant was allocated to women victims of sexual violence in Ambo region of Ethiopia.







## Logic for scholarship program

## Poverty and Education in Nepal

According to 2019 data, 17.4 percent of Nepali population are poor and multidimensional poverty index is 0.074. Across various indicators the highest number of people are deprived of housing materials, clean cooking fuel, years of schooling, assets and nutrition.


This suggests that poverty is connected to number of years students remain in school. Punya Foundation awarded the scholarship funds to those students who are most vulnerable to drop out of school and face multidimensional poverty on housing, food and clothes in remote Dhading and Sindhupalchok district. With supplies essential to attend school and fees paid with scholarship fund, these students will continue to remain in school until they graduate out of the school.

Going by the data published by National Statistics Bureau, literacy rate in Sindhupalchok is just 53.60 with female literacy standing at 51.88 and male at 67.97 (source- Statistical Yearbook 2021). It is very encouraging that 62% of our scholarship recipients are girls.

Similarly in Dhading, literacy rate is 59.8, with female literacy rate of mere 55.7 compared to male literacy standing at 71.08. This data provides the basis for Punya Foundation to prioritize on awarding scholarships to girl children in the district. Girls are more vulnerable to drop out of school and be household worker or agricultural helper or even have greater risk of being trafficked for sex trade. Much greater is this risk for orphan children who lost both their parents.

## Poverty and education in Ethiopia

Total of 9 students awarded scholarship, five new in 2022. These children belong to poor families living in remote parts of Ambo town, whose source of income is subsistence farming and cattle rearing. Often these are large families who cannot afford to send children to school because of food and income poverty.



## Vision 2023 and beyond

- Acquire sustainable funding by means of diversification of sources that includes endowment, and seeking foundation and government grants.
- Ensure enhanced/improved program implementation in those projects that represented poor performance in last three years.
- Integrate organizational capacity building into efficiency on governance and management roles of board and staff.

### **Strategy 2023-2026**

- Just coming out from the Covid-19 pandemic and the restrictions imposed by it, the Foundation will provide continuity to all the projects initiated and running in different countries. Mother and Child health initiative is being reviewed.
- In its efforts in expanding its collaboration, in 2023 and beyond, Foundation will work with a number of local and international non-government organizations to implement projects.
- The Foundation will explore various opportunities to expand its relief and other humanitarian projects locally in respective countries of operation.
- Develop initiatives to work with migrant/refugee communities in the US, Canada and Australia in collaboration with local organizations and government agencies.




